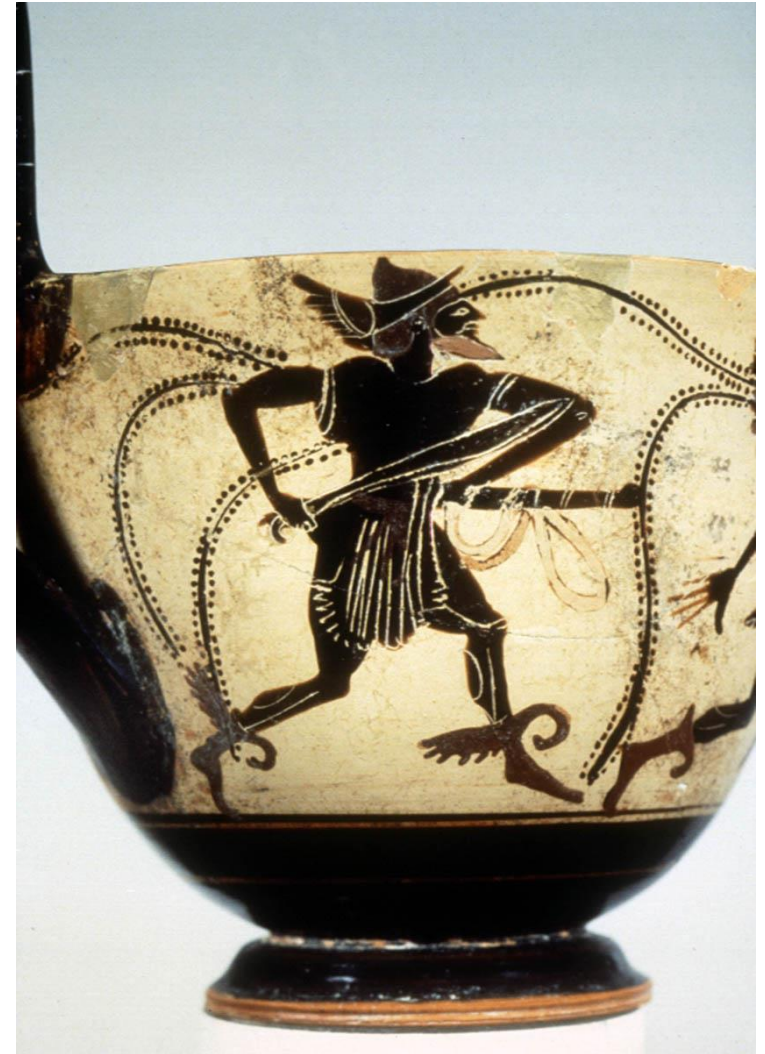

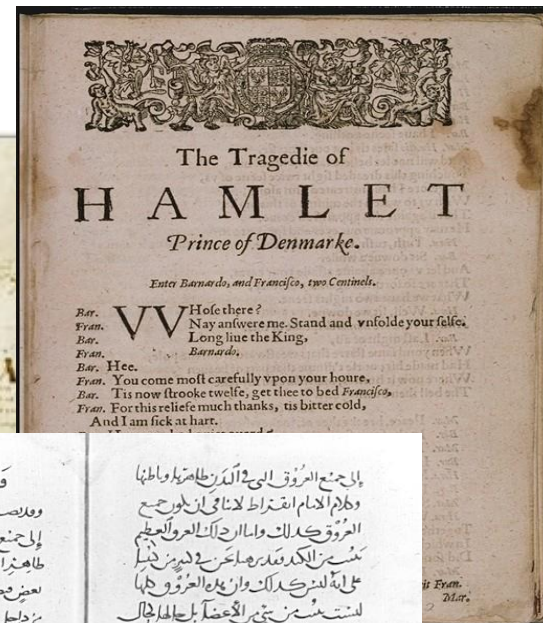

Ο Περσέας καλύπτει επίσης την πρώιμη σύγχρονη αγγλική γλώσσα, τον αμερικανικό εμφύλιο πόλεμο, την ιστορία και τοπογραφία του Λονδίνου, την ιστορία της Μηχανικής, την υποστήριξη της ανάγνωσης της αραβικής γλώσσας κτλ.



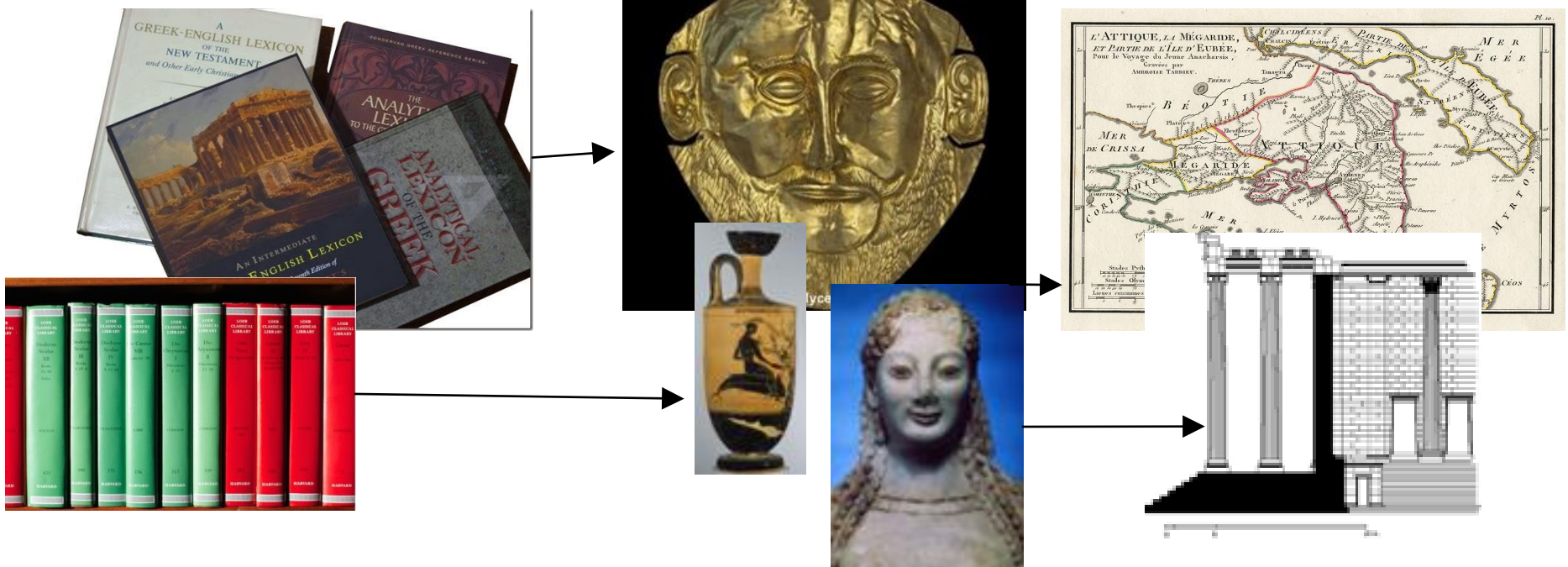


